REQUIREMENTS FOR RUNWAY ROVERS PROGRAM

1. Pet therapy teams are comprised of one dog and one owner/handler per team, hereinafter referred to as "Team" or "Teams."
2. The purpose of the Runway Rovers Program (the "Program") is to provide Teams the privilege of interacting with travelers and visitors at the Northwest Arkansas Regional Airport to provide relief and comfort from the stresses of travel (the "Permitted Activity").
3. Teams may provide the Permitted Activity in the public areas of the baggage claim, ticket counter lobby, and concourse, as well as the administrative offices of the Airport. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Northwest Arkansas Regional Airport Authority ("Authority") may, at any time, restrict Teams from any portion of the Airport premises.
4. All Permitted Activities shall be coordinated in advance with the Airport Director or her/his designated representative.
5. Each Team shall be assessed and evaluated by the Authority's Executive Director or his/her designated representative prior to acceptance into the Program. All owners/handlers shall be respectful and reliable, and appropriate dress is mandatory.
6. Dogs shall be well-groomed and well-mannered, and shall have completed obedience training. The Airport Director or her/his designated representative has the right to request exam and health screenings and documentation of obedience training upon request.
7. Teams shall in no way block or interfere with any Airport operations or access to the Terminal entrances.
8. Teams shall not interfere with the rights and privileges of other persons using the Airport premises. Teams understand and agree that any and all Airport operations have the right of way, and if necessary, Teams shall suspend the Permitted Activity to allow Airport operations to proceed.
9. Teams agree not to approach or interfere with any traveler, visitor or other person except as may be incidental to the peaceable and lawful exercise of the Permitted Activity.
10. Teams shall not shout, make outcries, or use any device to augment their voices.
11. Teams shall not sell, offer for sale, donate, or distribute any article of merchandise, food, refreshment, or any commodities.
12. Each owner/handler shall be responsible for the proper cleanup and removal of all animal waste.
13. Dogs shall be on a leash at all times.

14. Teams shall comply with all applicable Airport, State and Federal laws, rules, regulations and ordinances. This includes compliance with the Airport's security program.
15. Owners/handlers shall wear clothing and identification badges that clearly associate them with the Team's registering/certifying organization. Vests for both handlers and dogs shall be provided by the Authority. Owners/handlers may also provide their own dog vest with prior approval from the Authority. Owners/handlers who provide the Permitted Activity in the terminal concourse shall undergo a background check and secure an Airport identification badge which shall be worn at all times.

16. Teams shall provide the Permitted Activity as volunteers at no charge to the Authority or to any visitors, travelers, or other persons.
17. Owners/Handlers shall sign the Indemnification Agreement and Release and Waiver of Liability before bringing their dogs onto the Airport premises.
18. Each Team shall maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, subject to a \$2,000,000 annual aggregate covering bodily injury (including death), personal injury, and property damage, through either Alliance of Therapy Dogs, Love on a Leash, Pet Partners, or Therapy Dogs International, Inc. Each Team shall provide certificates evidencing all required insurance coverage to the Authority prior to performing the Permitted Activity, and the renewal thereof prior to the expiration of each policy period. Each Team shall also provide the Authority with a copy of its current registration/certification from Alliance of Therapy Dogs, Love on a Leash, Pet Partners, or Therapy Dogs International, Inc. prior to performing the Permitted Activity, and the renewal thereof prior to the expiration of each registration/certification.
19. No requirement of the Program shall serve to, or be construed to, waive the Authority's governmental immunity from suit in tort provided by Ark. Code Ann. § 14-362-104.
20. The Authority may at any time suspend or terminate the Program or any Team's participation therein with or without notice.
21. Teams shall not erect, maintain, or display any signs or other advertising at or on the Airport premises without first obtaining the written approval of the Airport Director.
22. Teams shall abide by all applicable security regulations of the Authority, Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") and Transportation Security Administration ("TSA"). Owners/Handlers who require unescorted access to Secured Areas of the Airport must make application for, and wear, Airport security badges. All such persons shall submit a set of fingerprints for a Criminal History Records Check ("CHRC") conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") as required by TSA Regulation Part 1542. In addition, the applicant must submit biographical information for a Security Threat Assessment ("STA") conducted by the TSA at the time the application is made. Upon a satisfactory completion of the CHRC and STA, the applicant must then attend a security badging session to receive training and have a security badge issued.
23. Owners/Handlers who conduct the Permitted Activity in Secured Areas of the Airport, shall be responsible for requesting the issuance of identification badges. Owners/Handlers shall (i) immediately report lost or stolen ID badges; (ii) immediately return ID badges if transferred from Airport assignment by Helping Paws of NWA; (iii) return all ID badges if suspended or terminated from the Program; and, (iv) return all ID badges upon suspension or termination of the Program.
24. The Program and any disputes between the Authority and any Team(s) shall be governed by the laws of the United States of America and the State of Arkansas, without giving effect to any conflict of laws principles. Owners/Handlers agree the exclusive venue for any lawsuit arising out of or relating to the Program shall be only the Circuit Court of Benton County, Arkansas, and hereby consent to and agree to submit themselves to personal jurisdiction in said Court.
